SHELTER AND SERVICES

Harbor House Crisis Shelters (HHCS) provide emergency shelter for women and families. Shelter is provided on a “first come, first serve” basis.

Guests are referred from community agencies, organizations, and congregations. All referred guests are screened. An intake or call back date is scheduled.

Single women stay in a dormitory-style room. Families receive a secure bedroom. Bedding, toiletries, diapers, towels and non-perishable food are provided as available.

HHCS’ case management approach is holistic. It incorporates coaching, life-goals setting, life-skill training, assessments, referrals, and community resources. All services are offered on-site or transportation assistance is provided.

TRANSITIONAL LIVING

HHCS offer a Transitional Living Center (TLC) for homeless families and single women who need supportive housing assistance. This program is designed to provide affordable housing and extensive case management. Residents live in an apartment building purchased by Faith United Methodist Church.

The TLC’s case management addresses the following barriers to attaining permanent housing: (1) poor credit; (2) prior eviction/poor rental history; (3) unpaid fines; (4) mental illness/disability; and (5) lack of education/employment.

While these barriers seem daunting, they can be addressed given the needed time, expertise and resources.
